


SILAT ATHELETES GIVE BACK


Singapore National Olympic Council Athletes' Commission

F: If you're ever feeling lonely or scared, find someone to talk to. We're all going through something together and let's keep growing from experiences in life!






PRESIDENT'S STAR CHARITY

CYCLING WITHOUT AGE

Started in Denmark in 2012 by Ole Kassow to get seniors back on their bicycle despite their limited mobility. Since then, Cycling Without Age has spread to over 42 countries around the world. In 2015, Cycling Without Age Singapore (CWAS) became the first chapter in Asia. CWAS's flagship offering is an innovative intervention programme for seniors and persons with limited mobility combating social isolation – intergenerational trishaw rides.






Their vision is a world in which no one faces social isolation, and has the opportunity to feel the wind in their hair, to give everyone the chance to feel a part of society, and the right to experience the city and nature close up from a trishaw ride and the opportunity to tell their stories in the environment where they have lived their lives. CWAS hopes to build bridges between generations and reinforce trust, respect and the social glue in our society.

- 1. When you "think" you saw something, you did not.
- 2. Keep the game moving.
- 3. When in doubt, do what is expected.
- 4. Answer questions, not statements.
- 5. Get the game going after a mistake or ejection.
- 6. Do not insert yourself or disrupt game rhythm if it is not necessary.



 - f. Female officials may wear a plain black head scarf


